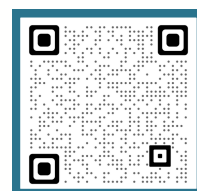
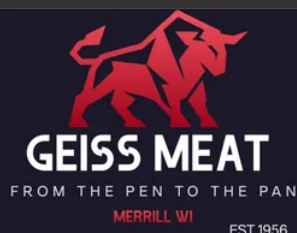

The forum will be held on **Wednesday, October 14** at the Lincoln County Service Center, Upper Floor. There will be a reception at 5:00PM. The forum starts at 6:00PM, featuring perspectives from:

Wisconsin State Representative Patrick Snyder, Chair of the Wisconsin State Assembly Committee on Children and Families, will provide a legislative and policy perspective on the challenges facing Wisconsin families and the child care system.

Micki Krueger, Assistant Director of Childcaring, Inc., will bring the perspective of child care providers and the regional child care resource and referral system, including the challenges providers face in recruiting, retaining, and sustaining their workforce.

Brian Kalish, Executive Director of Advance Wisconsin Employment, will address the connection between child care, workforce participation, and the ability of employers to recruit and retain employees.
